A STATEMENT FROM THE REVD BRUCE THOMPSON, CHAIR OF THE LINCOLNSHIRE METHODIST DISTRICT

9 September 2022

Dear Friends,

The nation has lost its finest jewel.

We have lost our wise, gracious, caring leader.

Her Majesty the Queen was an inspiration and example for us all.

She met virtually every leader of the Free World over the past 70 years, yet she said nothing of their conversations or of them, not casting comment on their character or their strengths or weaknesses.

In an age of leaks to the media, she knew how to keep confidences, of when to speak and when to remain silent.

In an age where political leaders come and go so rapidly, she was a constant presence, reassuringly so, everything may change but the Queen was still on the throne.

In an age of self-service, she exercised self-sacrifice based on her unwavering faith.
