The Shop

The shop is open every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 10am till 2pm.

We have cards for all occasions-birthdays, anniversaries, sympathy, get well, thinking of you, as well as cards for Christian occasions such as baptism, confirmation, first communion. All our cards have a Christian message.

We have a large selection of Bibles and Christian books as well as small gifts.

We now stock Eco products- washing-up liquid, washing liquid and liquid soap and hope to also have shortly shampoo and conditioner. All of these can be dispensed into your own containers, if you bring them in, at a fraction of the cost in other shops. At the same time, you will be saving our planet from the misuse of plastic.

We have Fairtrade products- coffee, tea, chocolate, biscuits, jams, and kitchen and toilet rolls.

And we also have a library of jigsaws for you to borrow and many pre-loved Christian books which you can buy for a small donation.

The Cafe Area

New to the shop, is our Café, where you can, for a donation, enjoy a cup of delicious coffee and a Fairtrade biscuit. Come and see us.

School Uniform Exchange

The shop is now also home to the School Uniform Exchange Scheme. Bring in any unwanted items of school uniform when the shop is open and, for a donation, choose a new-to-you blazer, skirt, trousers, shirt for most of the schools in the Brigg area.

The Food Bank

Over 2023, we are seeing an increase in need of our Food Bank. Our Food Bank is run on a referral basis which means those that are referred to us also are receiving support from a third party to enable them to receive the required help and advice.

We have increased our awareness in the area and this is still continuing as we let as many third parties know of our existence and ability to support those experiencing financial difficulty and food poverty.

When referred, we will contact the client to discuss what they need and if they can collect or require a delivery. We are not open set days for the Food Bank, but are more flexible to the referrals as and when these are received.

Referral agencies include Citizen's Advice North Lincolnshire, local schools, the Children's Centre, the Council, Social Services, Ongo and many other local agencies.

The Community Food Pantry

We started the Community Food Pantry in December 2022 following more and more of a need being identified locally, particularly following the cost of living crisis and energy crisis. This has been a resounding success with over 110 households attending each month and around 25-30% new faces each month.

It is key for us to be able to keep the Pantry running and we review the success of this on a quarterly basis and make any slight changes to ensure the continued success and running of the Pantry. One of these changes has been to move to baskets, rather than bags, to make it easier when moving around the Pantry, together with a layout change with the heavier items first and lighter last.

From September 2023, the Community Food Pantry will be £4 for a basket of food, and this will also include one refillable toiletry item from our shop too. So please bring along a small (300ml) empty container and you can fill with one of our refillables.

We are very thankful for all the business donations that help run our Pantry, such as the behind the scenes stock at Lidl and Aldi which we receive - and all other businesses too. Also for the support from Broughton Allotments. Together with grants and funding that keep this running - and of course everyone who attends too as these donations go straight back into the next Pantry.

We also have received voluntary support over the year from The Nottingham Building Society and Tesco too which is always a huge support. We have also welcomed third party specialists such as Citizen's Advice North Lincolnshire, Barclays and Health Visitors.
